Are We Seeking A Miracle OR The Master?

Is it just me, or does anybody else have a difficult time knowing what to declare in the “About” section of Facebook under “Religious Views”? I mean, how does one sum up his beliefs in two sentences or less? Maybe I’m not one to ask that question since I was raised in an ultra-Fundamentalist and Separatist religious environment, married a Church of Christ girl in a Charismatic Anglican Church, am a member of a Methodist Church, serve as an Assistant Spiritual Director in an Ecumenical organization, work for The Salvation Army, have a son who is a student at a Baptist College and is a member of an Episcopal Church, but visits the Eastern Orthodox Church with his flat mate and participates in a Messianic Jewish Congregation on Friday nights, and have a daughter who attends a Bible Church. Perhaps my family and I are just a bit confused! It reminds me of a five year old boy named Matthew who lived next door to me when I was ten and I was determined to evangelize the neighborhood. 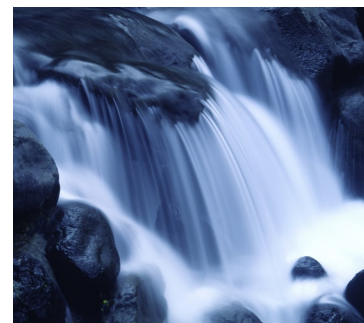
In John chapter 6, Jesus was in the most popular phase of His earthly

As I write, Pentecost Sunday has just come and gone. All over the world the Body of Christ has been remembering, celebrating, and calling on the Holy Spirit to come and renew hearts, transform minds, heal bodies, and convince souls.

I wonder how many of us need to experience a Pentecost in our lives?

Perhaps - like the disciples watching Jesus leave this earth at the Ascension – someone important has left you – ascending to the next phase of his or her life story. 4. PRAY!! Pray, pray, pray that the Spirit will fall afresh in North Texas, that Emmaus will be an instrument of grace in our midst, that our churches will indeed grow up into the maturity of our only Lord and Savior.

I look forward to working with you as we all strive to build-up the Body of Christ in love.

Texoma Emmaus “A Look At Our Past”

The following article and information was taken directly from the Texoma Emmaus Community Newsletter, dated September, 1995:

The countdown continues bringing us closer to the first walks for the Texoma Emmaus Community. Much work has been done by countless people in order for these walks to take place. Many saints have committed time, money, ideas, experience and prayer to bring our community to this point.

For what reasons has there been such sacrifice? 1. To ensure that people we don't even know can attend a walk and hopefully recognize God while there. 2. Because God has no better way to touch a life than by using His servants. 3. To demonstrate His love is THERE all the time, especially in the face of other human beings.
